From the Lutheran Confessions

CONCERNING THE RIGHTEOUSNESS OF FAITH BEFORE GOD

The Question at Issue

"It is the unanimous confession of our churches according to the Word of God and the content of the Augsburg Confession that we poor sinners are justified before God and saved solely by faith in Christ, so that Christ alone is our righteousness. He is truly God and man since in Him the divine and human natures are personally united to one another (Jer. 23:6; I Cor. 1:30; II Cor 5:21). Because of the foregoing a question has arisen, According to which nature is Christ our righteousness? Two false and mutually contradictory teachings have invaded some churches.

"One party has held that Christ is our righteousness only according to His Godhead. When He dwells in us by faith, over against this indwelling Godhead, the sins of all men are esteemed like a drop of water over against the immense ocean. Others, however, held that Christ is our righteousness before God only according to the human nature..."

Antitheses: [That is, Rejection of the] Contrary False Doctrine

- "According [to what we do believe, teach, and confess, as previously stated] we reject and condemn all the following errors:
- "1. [We reject the position] that Christ is our righteousness only according to the divine nature, etc.
- "2. [We reject the position] that Christ is our righteousness only according to the human nature, etc.
- "3. [We also reject the teaching] that when the righteousness of faith is spoken of in the pronouncements of the Prophets and Apostles, the words 'to justify' and 'to be justified' do not mean to absolve or to be absolved from sin and to obtain the forgiveness of sins, but mean to be made righteous in fact before God on account of the love and virtue that the Holy Spirit has infused and the works resulting therefrom.

- "4. [We reject the teaching] that faith does not look alone to Christ's obedience, but also to His divine nature (in so far as it dwells and works within us), and that by such indwelling our sins are covered up.
- "5. [We reject the teaching] that faith is a kind of trust in the obedience of Christ that can exist and remain in a person though he doe not truly repent and gives no evidence of resulting love, but continues to sin against his conscience...
- "6. [We also reject the teaching] that not God Himself but only divine gifts well in believers.
- "7. [We reject the teaching] that faith saves because by faith there is begun in us the renewal which consists in love toward God and our fellowman.
- "8. [We reject the teaching] that faith indeed has the most prominent role in justification, but that also renewal and love belong to our righteousness before God, not indeed as if it were the primary cause of our righteousness, but that nevertheless our righteousness before God is incomplete and imperfect without such love and renewal.
- "9. [We likewise reject the teaching] that believers are justified before God and saved both by the righteousness of Christ reckoned to them and by the incipient new obedience, or in part by the reckoning to them of Christ's righteousness and in part by our incipient new obedience.
- "10. [We also reject the position] that the promise of grace becomes our own by faith in the heart and by the confession of the lips, along with other virtues.
- "11. [And, finally, we reject the position] that faith does not justify without good works, in such a way that good works are necessary for righteousness and that unless they are present a person cannot be justified."
