Sunday May 19th New Process For Children's Sunday School Opening

Who: Upper elementary & middle school kids (Sarah Rhein's class) and preschool & early elementary kids ("littles" class), the Sunday school class teachers, the Elder on duty, and the Choir director. We would gladly welcome a volunteer to assist with the snack distribution and cleanup.

What: Change in Sunday morning routine and flow. Children should come directly to the youth/conference room downstairs for snacks and opening prayer. Both classes will eat snack, an elder will open with prayer, the youngest children will split off to their class, the Choir director will conduct some music practice/education time for older children while snack is cleared up, then the older children's class will meet for the remainder of the adult Bible Class period.

Where: Please have children go directly downstairs <u>via the stairs on</u> the parking lot side of the building. (Turn left leaving the nave. The goal is to direct the flow of quick-moving children away from the flow of adults and seniors navigating the stairs on the right-hand side.)

When: Right after the service ends and you exit the nave.

Why: Sunday school opening will begin promptly so that (among other reasons):

- 1. Children can get their snack right away instead of competing in the adult line and becoming distressed by the wait.
- 2. Children can be engaged right away, reducing boredom/ wandering/ hallway hazards, and maximizing opportunity for purposeful engagement.
- 3. Allows time for sacred music education element / choir rehearsals on Sunday morning, incorporating children who cannot rehearse on Wednesday afternoons.

Logistics: Children will need some parental cuing and reminders until the flow becomes habitual. Parents, please remind your children where to go after church for the next few Sundays. BOCE plans on providing the kids' snacks for the first month while we tweak the new process. Planning Catechesis for Academic Year 2024-2025

Emmaus has traditionally welcomed and encouraged school aged children to attend midweek catechesis classes with Pastor. The schedule in the past has been flexed to accommodate families and other extracurricular schedules. The growing number of member families with school age children and variation in school schedules and extracurricular commitments will likely make planning catechesis more complicated this coming year. The BOCE/Pastor would like to have a proposed schedule that accommodates both homeschooled and traditionally schooled families solidly in place before July so that families can plan their schedules for the upcoming year accordingly. Catechesis will resume in September. If you have school aged children, please talk to Pastor or a member of the BOCE in the next few weeks about what catechesis schedule could work for your family. Current ideas being floated include moving catechesis later in the evening on Wednesday (so traditionally schooled children could join) or having a second catechesis class on a different weekday evening or Saturdays. Children's Choir schedule could also be affected. Please weigh in. We want catechesis and children's choir to be possible for all families.
